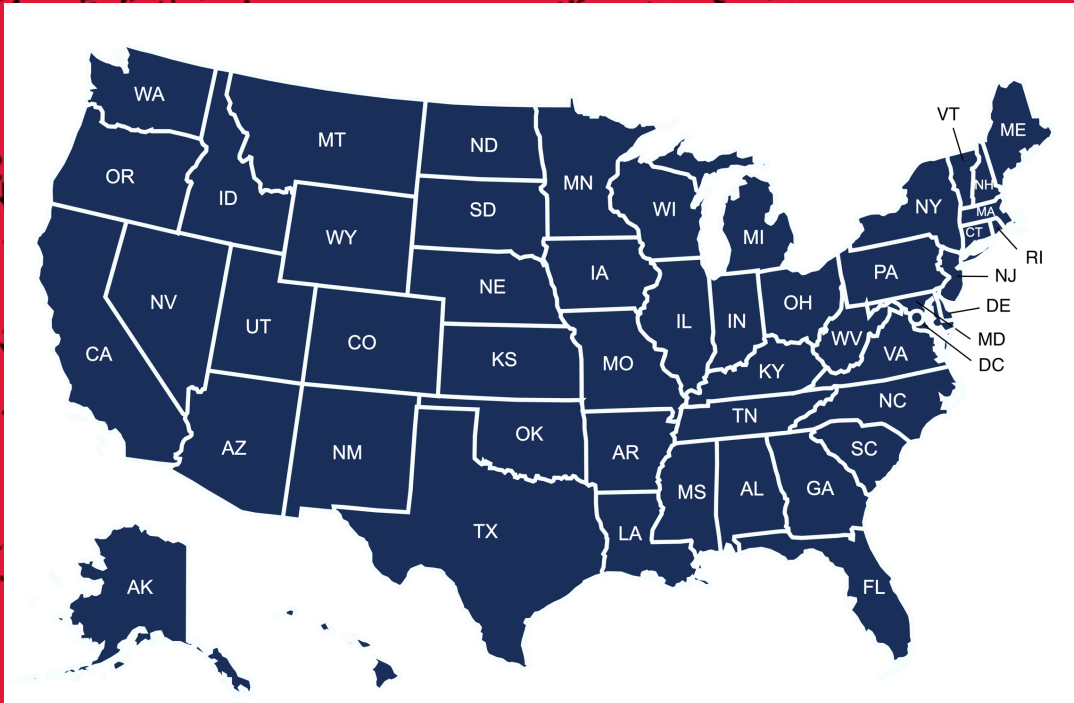

- Meeting them where they are – Youth Centered
- Check yourself (before you wreck yourself!)
- Positive Youth Development – Strengths Based
- Encourage peer leadership
- Embrace different opinions
- Understand triggers and trauma (Trauma Informed)
- Healthy Boundaries
- Respect different learning styles (doodles)
